## Highlights

We continued Writer's Workshop completing a few of the writing assignments we have had on the back burner before we begin our next unit of nonfiction writing to go along with our nonfiction reading unit! What's to come for writing? Third graders are going to have a chance to write a nonfiction piece on something they are an "EXPERT" at. We are also going to be spending some time continuing our research on the Ohlone, and becoming an "expert" on their area of interest, pertaining to this are of study! For Reader's Workshop we continued practicing looking at nonfiction writing and pulling out the main ideas, our boxes, and the supporting details, bullets that go under the boxes. We took a closer look at articles/stories that aren't organized with subtopics, and how to read the complete paragraph, identify the main idea within the paragraph, and then write bullets supporting that idea. We read a fascinating article on octopus. Very cool! In Math, we continued working on applying subtraction strategies to larger numbers. This is still a bit of a sticky area for a few 3rd graders. PLEASE go over this with them at home, asking them to show you the strategies of using a number line OR constant differences, and practice giving them problems where they can teach you how to do what we are doing in class. The more they practice explaining these concepts, the more clear it is in their minds! CONTINUE having your 3rd graders commit their facts to memory! Science, we started looking at our Science text books and started to take notes in the "Boxes and Bullets" format, on the different types of energy. Art in room 305, this week, we talked a bit about perspective drawing as well as shadowing, and applied this effect to snowmen! They turned out completely adorable! I have a little picture above!
