## Highlights

This week for Writer's Workshop a deadline for expert report and Ohlone reports have been established! All  $3^{\rm rd}$  graders are expected to have these completed by next Friday, the 18th!! For those that have finished, we began working on creating a newspaper, comprised of different aspects of our lives here at Havens. Some have come up with the idea to do a "Then and Now" column, where they are developing interview questions for some members of the staff, and others are looking at ways to better things, such as lunch! The format is going to remain the same as what we have been practicing this trimester, which they are all pretty solid on. For Reader's Workshop, we continued looking at character, and developing theories, collecting evidence that will help us make predictions, and then later this week, looking more closely at how main characters in ALL stories travel along a story mountain, where a character will face a problem that ends up getting bigger and bigger and then reaches a turning point, and finally resolves it's problem. They began keeping track in their characters in their notebooks, drawing the outline of a mountain and then building up the sides. We also introduced "Book Clubs" today. Nothing formal YET, but they are starting to get excited! More on that to come next week! In Math, we continued working through unit 5, which is almost coming to an end. I have been impressed with their ability to comprehend, and create both multiplication and division word problems. They are really getting the hang of this! For Number Corner, we are tracking elapsed time, a good review, and we also have a very large, 5x6 foot chart where we are collecting area and perimeter. Our only problem is finding space to hang all these cool things! Help them find examples of area and perimeter in their everyday lives. CONTINUE having your 3rd graders commit their facts to memory! For Science, we have had a great time exploring space through a series of "Space School" videos. The 3rd graders have been so into this whole topic, taking avid notes along the way. We have learned in depth about all 9 planets, and got to watch a fascinating video on supernovas! Maybe one day one of our very own will be on a Space expedition!!!
