In Writing this week, third graders got their first taste of the writing process, where we spend time brainstorming about our topic, drafting it, peer editing, and then final drafting. It was a short topic to write on, so they were able to go through the whole process in one writing period! A good introduction! Our writing assignment was for them to choose "The Best Part of Me." We read Rapunzel and had a discussion about attributes and pointed out Rapunzel's was her hair. We also read another book and chose our best attribute and came up with reasons why they were and did our writing piece. They turned out very nice! We learned that each and every one of us has our own special physical attributes that make us a part of who we are. Be sure to take a look at Back-2-School night next week! They have also been doing various reflections across the curricula in their many different journals they have this year! For Reader's Workshop, we have had a few really fun lessons, mostly focusing on building our own reading lives. We are learning about the importance of choosing good fit books and have our guide to help us. We are also learning to read our books as if they are gold! They loved our lesson on learning what a curmudgeon was and pretending to read as if they were a curmudgeon vs. reading as if it were gold! Be sure to ask them about this! It was lots of fun! This week, their reading log was also introduced. This is intended to be an ongoing project throughout the year, both at home and at school. Their log is to "LIVE" in their backpacks, and when they read at least 20 min at home independently, it is to be logged, and we will do the same in class during workshop. More info to come on this at Back-2-School night! In Math our focus this week was on building a community of learners and taking a closer look at our addition and subtraction facts through 20. They were introduced to their first "Work Place" game, which is a fun component of Bridges Math that they will be doing throughout the units of study. They are loving it so far! We have also already had two sessions with our kindergarten buddies. This is a great experience for them to have the chance to be teachers and have the patience to work with them! We always have to end our buddy session with some "TCMs," Totally Cute Moments!!
