Highlights

This week for Writer's Workshop we were able to focus a lot on our "Expert" reports, and they are turning out really well! It is so fun to see something that each individual 3rd grader is excited about, come out in the form of a guide, or a pamphlet. The fun thing about this writing project is that they have also had to do a bit of research to help complete their chapters, which ties in with our studies these last few weeks for reader's workshop. The 3rd graders are also in the process of typing their "Small Moment" story from last trimester. I am patiently waiting for 10 more, so please encourage your 3rd grader to finish these at home on their google drive. For Reader's Workshop, our focus was quite challenging and a very advanced concept, and I was very impressed with how well 3rd graders were able to handle this. We took a deeper look at biographies and how to read them. We have learned that many biographies need to be read through two lenses, one lens is the narrative lens, and then the other is the expository lens. The example that was given was if we were reading about a violinist who lived during WWII, we would expect to learn about the narrative of the violinist, and then, learn a little history about WWII. Keeping this in mind while reading is not easy! We also learned about one of my favorite tricks to summarizing what we have read. That trick is to be able to answer these questions: Somebody... Wanted... But... So... Have your 3rd graders explain this to you and have them try it out in summarizing something they are currently reading! It really works! In **Math**, we continued focusing this week on measurement in grams. liters, and meters. We had a fun scavenger hunt, finding objects that would fit whatever was spun on the spinner, finding the mass of clay. and length and also collecting liquid volume. We also took a closer look at multi-step word problems, converting milliliters to liters, and what not. I am very pleased with the automaticity I am seeing as these 3rd graders take on these challenges. Check with your 3rd grader to see if they can explain this concept to you. CONTINUE having your 3rd graders commit their facts to memory! We had our first round and complete success! On to 3's!! Social Studies this week, we talked about Civil Rights pertaining to Dr. Martin Luther King JR. For Science, we continued reading about Sun, Moon, and Stars, and had a great lesson with Mr. Taylor, developing hypothesis for an experiment on how much water plants need to survive.
