Highlights

We began 2016 Writer's Workshop with thinking about some resolutions for the New Year and reflecting on those, hoping they will be able to stick with them. We took a look at the format of a 5paragraph essay, and they were off. The 3rd graders are also in the process of typing their "Small Moment" story from last trimester. If they aren't completed, please encourage them to finish these at home on their google drive. For Reader's Workshop, we are wrapping up our nonfiction unit with a focus on biographies. We are in the process of learning a lot of different approaches on how to tackle biographies, for it is a different type of reading than expository text. One of the main take aways is that it is important to at least know why the person they are reading about is important and what they did in order to have the honor of a bio written on them. From that, readers are to then formulate a main idea, and find the evidence from the text that supports that. We have learned that a lot of times, authors include a lot of facts that aren't that important. We had a fun analogy about LeBron James and waffles. Be sure to ask them about this! In Math. we continued our lessons on session 4 and our focus this week was on finding the mass of certain objects, and the difference between mass and weight. Check with your 3rd grader to see if they can explain this concept to you. We also reviewed telling time and elapsed time, which they seem to be fairly comfortable with. Have them practice telling time on an analog clock, the exposure to this format will be helpful. Also having them keep track of their activities and how long they take, and totaling those up would be helpful too. CONTINUE having your 3rd graders commit their facts to memory! Next Friday, January 15th, we will have our first test. Everyone will be starting with the factors of 2. They will have 1 min. to answer 30 problems, identically formatted to the ones they have been practicing for the last few weeks. Science this week was a little tough, for we started our unit on "Sun, Moon and Stars," and we had a lot of cloudy days! We finally got a little peek of sun on Friday and were able to track the sun 3 times that day, figuring out our cardinal directions and tracking that sun from East to West. More activities on this unit to come!
