This week for Writer's Workshop, we continued to spend some time working towards completing our assignments thus far. Others have made really good progress on their portion of our newspaper, and it is beginning to take shape. This week, we also had a good time learning about a form of poetry, and studied the format of a Limerick, in honor of St. Patrick's Day. We got some clever poems, for sure! For Reader's Workshop, we continued to work on looking more deeply at our characters in both the books that we are reading on our own, as well as the books we are reading for our book clubs. In checking in with all groups, I was very impressed with what work had been done thus far. I really stressed the importance of making sure to note all findings as they are reading, on post-its, but also in their reading journal, for it will help aid in book club discussions. They are all really enjoying the independence this project brings, and the decisions they get to make as a group, within reason of course. Their discussions were very good today! In Math, we completed Unit 5 on multiplication, division, and area and will be starting Unit 6, Geometry, on Monday. Make sure to keep working on the Home Connection pages if you haven't, just to help reinforce the skills that we have been learning and working with so far. CONTINUE having your 3rd graders commit their facts to memory! For Science, we continued our study on Space, consolidating all our notes, and figuring out what part of our studies sparked our interest most, for our culminating mini project. We also

had a very "sweet" test today on the moon phases! I am pleased to announce that everyone has a fairly good understanding of these different phases, and can hopefully identify these phases when looking up at the moon! Be sure to ask your 3<sup>rd</sup> grader about this test!!
