I was very impressed with their ability to understand the format of this type of writing, and successfully write their very first 5 paragraph essay with ease! Highlights

We continued Writer's Workshop this week putting finishing touches on our persuasive writing. I was really impressed with how well they understood the format of how to write a persuasive piece, including research, a strong introduction, 3 body paragraphs, and a conclusion. They all had a lot of fun coming up with their own slogan, standing up for their stance on the issue! For Reader's Workshop we continued practicing looking at nonfiction writing and pulling out the main ideas, our boxes, and the supporting details, bullets that go under the boxes. The 3rd graders are really enjoying this type of reading and note taking, to the point that they are quite disappointed when the session is up! I encourage them to continue reading nonfiction texts at home, even the newspaper! In Math, we worked on applying subtraction strategies to larger numbers. We discovered that similar to the addition strategy of "Give and Take," subtraction has one called "Constant Differences." Be sure to ask your 3rd grader how this strategy works. The more they practice explaining these concepts, the more clear it is in their minds! CONTINUE having your 3rd graders commit their facts to memory! We have continued taking practice timed tests this week a practice test today, some in 2 min. 1.5, and on Friday, we tried a minute. Most of the 3rd graders were pleased with what they were able to do, and have been working on good strategies on how to approach some of their more difficult facts. Social Studies, we continued reading about some of the Native American tribes that lived in California, learning about their culture and their daily lives, as well as our field trip to the Jr. Center, which focused on the Ohlone people that once lived in our very area.
